BANGKOK CITY TOUR (09:00 – 15:00)

A visit to the Royal Grand Palace, the nation's landmark and most praised royal monument in Thailand is a must. The palace, which is the former royal residence of the Chakri Kings, is the perfect example of an ancient Siamese court. Built in 1782 by the King Rama I, it was the centre of power for more than 150 years. Today, the palace is Bangkok's major landmark and most popular tourist attraction.

Please note that photography is permitted in the Royal Palace Grounds and in the compounds of the Emerald Buddha Temple, but not inside the buildings. Also, note that the chapel is a national shrine and that you will be required to wear proper attire (no bare shoulders, knees or strapless-heel shoes). Shoes must be removed before entering the temple buildings as a matter of respect.

Then, proceed the visit to the Klongs (Canals). 19th century Bangkok was laced with canals, giving the capital the designation of the 'Venice of the East'. Surviving canals as well as the Chao Phraya River itself (meaning the River of Kings) provide memorable vignettes of a traditional waterborne way-of-life that has remained essentially unchanged over the centuries. The river and canals can conveniently be explored by public transport or via a traditional long tailed boat. The tour will finally take you to Wat Arun (Temple of Dawn), this famous Chao Phraya riverbank landmark, which is best known for its porcelain encrusted 79-metre central sparkling pagoda.

After lunch, spend some leisure time to do local souvenir shopping
